

ALICE HUNT CEMETERY

The Alice Hunt Cemetery is located on the westerly side of VT Route 114 shortly before the junction with VT 141. It is named after the 16 year old daughter of Jesse Hunt, owner of a sawmill near the outlet of Wallace Pond. Alice died in 1890. It is impossible to tell by the dates on the monuments whether Alice was the first to be buried in this cemetery. It appears that some bodies were moved to this site from other locations.

Land for this cemetery was first purchased by the Town of Canaan from Thomas P. Judd on Dec. 1, 1890 for the sum of \$200. This parcel extended about 222 feet along the highway and was 198 feet deep, with an area of about one acre. This deed is recorded in Book. I, page 7 of Canaan Land Records.

A second parcel, adjacent to and north of the original parcel, was purchased from Thomas P. Judd on June 26, 1925 for the sum of \$200.00. This parcel also contains about one acre of land. The deed is recorded in Book N, page 31.

The Alice Hunt Cemetery presently (Feb. 1999) has a total area of two (2) acres, with most of the plots already sold.

This cemetery has been surveyed and a plan Revised to 4/20/84 is located in the Canaan Town Office. A copy of this plan is attached herewith.
